

#### April 4, 2023 Speakers

#### **Stacey Goodman**

Police Officer, 9/11 First Responder and Author

Stacey Goodman was a young police officer with the Suffolk County Police Department located on Long Island when she got the call to serve at Ground Zero – the day after the attacks. Goodman was part of a federal agency called the Disaster Mortuary Operational Response Team and assisted the medical examiner in a temporary morgue set up next to the massive pile of debris from the downed towers. "My solemn duty was to do preliminary identification of all the remains that were brought to us," said Goodman. She worked 12-hour shifts – 7 days a week for 23 days. There was no time for emotions or exhaustion. "My duty was to those victims – innocent people going about their day, and it was all taken away from them in a blink of an eye."

It's been over 20 years since Goodman worked at Ground Zero. She would eventually go on to serve the Suffolk County Police Department as a detective. She retired now and makes her home in Cave Creek. She wrote a book about her experience titled "The Dust Never Settles." While the memories fade, she hopes her book can educate future generations about what really happened. #### Water Roundtable with Congressman Paul Gosar attended by Gaynell Crews

As part of Supervisor's Johnsons staff, I was honored to attend a "Water Roundtable with Congressman Gosar" this week. The event was well attended by both elected officials, legal experts and very educated professionals.

Many on the dais spoke, including our Mayor, Cal Sheehy. The different regions in Arizona experience their specific concerns. Lake Havasu and other river cities are unique as we solely depend on the Colorado River for our water. Conservation is key for our water supply along with treating and reusing that water for irrigation and farming. Other areas in Arizona have a good supply of water but it is quite brackish and requires treatment to be potable. These waters would require desalinization. While not as salty as the ocean, still would need treatment.

Desalinization plants are very expensive to build and take a very long time. Plus, how to power them for operation? One expert is very knowledgeable regarding small portable nuclear reactors. These could easily power smaller plants and be portable.

Eradication of salt cedars from our lands is another conservation method. The salt cedars are not native, invasive and sucks large amounts of water from the earth. Very hard to remove them completely. They used an example of a ranch in Flagstaff area that spent a couple years eradicating the salt cedars from several acres on their land. They were eventually able to replant with native trees. But after the cedars were gone, a natural spring came into view and started running. They said the spring had been gone for about 50 years.

There is hope for our water situation for sure. It is not one solution but many. The fact of doing our part, even on a small basis, does help. We must think of these projects when it comes to funding to save our future generations.




