Article on Squatters, submitted by member Joan Dzuro

SQUATTERS IN ARIZONA

There have been numerous stories over the past few weeks of squatters in other states taking legitimate homeowners homes away from them while they are gone for a month or more. This has caused concerns among our club members. I hope this information that has been gathered is helpful in putting to rest what squatters are allowed to do and not do in Arizona, specifically Lake Havasu City.

First, why allow squatters at all. Virtually every state in our union has squatter laws which was meant to allow people to take over abandoned property in rural areas and revitalize them, thus reducing blight in the area. Each state differs on what time frames you have to possess the property and what requirements you have to fulfill. I am not an attorney but in the resources I could read it appears in Arizona someone needs to have possession of a property for from 2 to 5 years, they must maintain and make improvements to the property, they must pay the property taxes on the property while there. There is then a procedure that has to be followed in order to get a deed to the property and be allowed to have full ownership.

Our AZ Representative Leo Biasiucci is trying to strengthen these laws by adding language that would make it legal for a property owner to remove a squatter immediately. It allows law enforcement to assist in the removal if the squatter's do not leave upon the request of the property owners and they can be charged with trespassing, damage, theft, or any other crime that has been committed by the squatter. The bill number is SB1129 if you would like to read the exact text.

Due to our weather in the summer and the number of seasonal residents we have people are concerned they go away for a few weeks, come home and someone has their home. Not so in Lake Havasu City. If you come home and someone is living in your home without your authority call our local police department and report their unauthorized occupancy of your home. This would fall under either criminal trespassing or criminal burglary (both felonies) and the police can arrest them on the spot and take them to jail to stand trial for this offense.

There are things you can do to protect your properties from squatters, especially vacant land that you own: check on your property or have someone you trust regularly check on your property, if there are buildings on the property make it appear someone is living there (lights go on and off, have someone randomly go and check inside the property, don't let papers or door hangers or mail pile up in front of the house).

We are blessed to live in a state that takes our property owner rights seriously. I hope that this article is helpful in securing your property while not on it and understanding steps you can take to keep people from intruding.






